

Reimbursement List

This is not a complete list. Please contact FamilyLink if you have questions about whether an item or service will be reimbursed.

What can be reimbursed?

- *All books, curriculum materials and supplies listed as resources required to support the subject goal(s) in the Written Student Learning Plan (WSLP) and approved by your consulting teacher.*
- *Memberships and/or admission fees to educational institutions (Pacific Science Center, museums, zoos, etc.) for enrolled students. (Plus, for one parent accompanying their young child/ren.)*
- *Food items for a class or unit study on nutrition or cooking or ethnic studies, within reasons.*
- *Any private tutoring, music lesson/PE class that supports and is reflected in the WSLP.*
- *Educational activities that support and are reflected in the WSLP (admissions to exhibits, theater productions, educational films, cultural events, etc.)*
- *Costume materials for drama productions, within reason.*
- *Equipment such as calculators, telescopes, microscopes, etc. (Check with FamilyLink before buying these items.)*
- *Educational games.*

What cannot be reimbursed?

- *Any materials of a religious nature.*
- *Any performance (films, concerts, etc.) that are not educational in nature and do not support the WSLP.*
- *An expensive version of a less expensive item (prismacolor pencils vs. crayola)*
- *Computer hardware.*
- *Any (non-consumable) equipment that FamilyLink has in surplus quantity.*
- *Gas, mileage, parking, food or lodging on family field trips.*
- *Food items (unless you are teaching a class or unit study on nutrition or cooking or ethnic studies).*
- *Permanent additions to your home, e.g. greenhouses, raised beds, ponds, gardens and supplies, train layouts, art bins or other containers for storage.*
- *Sports equipment, backpacks, uniforms, clothing items and shoes (except costume materials for drama).*
- *Any materials for items to be made and then given away (as this would constitute gifting of public funds).*
- *Musical instruments/supplies (guitar strings, reeds, metronomes). No rent-to-own musical instruments will be reimbursed.*
- *Dues for organizations such as Scouts, Camp Fire, etc.*
- *Membership/annual fees/initiation fees for clubs.*

Consumable Items

A consumable item is one that has a one-time only use and cannot reasonably be returned for future use by other students, e.g., a music lesson, admission to a museum, a workbook.

Non-Consumable Items

A non-consumable item is one that can be returned for use by others, e.g., a CD, a book, maps, and educational games. These items are considered FamilyLink property and must be returned at the end of the school year, unless you have arranged with your consulting teacher to use them over the summer.
