so we can see who needs more support and so they can be leveled in groups for support, practice and




extension. The iReady curriculum has an emphasis on dialogue and conceptual understanding, which our teachers love.

# Pick up and Drop Off

Drop off in the morning is going well. Please be aware that you can drop off in the second lot, so if the line is long, there is a

driving drop off lane there, too. After the bumpy start, our beginning and end of days are going well. Our record end of the car line is 3:51. On average, the car pick up is done between 3:50-3:55 and the buses depart at that same time. We appreciate your support by being

# Academic and Social Emotional Supports Tier 2 and 3

Our Special Education services (Tier 3) began individual support the first days of school and groups started the second week. They are well in the swing of things. For Tier 2 (Math and Reading Support) we are busy assessing students and figuring out which students need support. Groups will be starting soon. If your student qualifies for support in Reading or Math we will let you know and they will get 30-40 minutes of support four times a week. Our PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention Support) staff are also gearing up to begin social emotional groups for students who would benefit from a short term group.

### **Volunteers**

We will begin having volunteers in the school in a limited capacity after curriculum night. Volunteers will need to upload proof of vaccination as well as have an updated volunteer background check, which is found <u>on our website</u>. All volunteers must submit updated forms this year. Volunteers will also need to maintain 3+ foot distance from students and wear masks, or ideally, work with students when they are outside. We will carefully assess each volunteer request to balance the support and student safety.
